# Ushering in a bright future — by bridging the new and the old

SU traces its long history and tradition back to 1906 at the beginning of South Korea’s modern education system. Under the guiding principle of cultivating “truthful and loving helpers,” the university extensively worked on nurturing individuals of high intellectual, spiritual, and physical capacity. The goal was to help the learners lead a meaningful life, first, as happy individuals and second, as people who make a difference in the world. To this end, we at SU have continuously cultivated creative leaders with upright character by delivering Christian education firmly grounded on Scripture.

<b>Oct. 1906</b>	- With Pastor Smith as the first president, Euimyung (Righteous Light) School, the first SDA school in Korea, was founded on Adventist principles for the purpose of training religious workers.
<b>Apr. 1931</b>	- The school relocated to SDA Headquarters (Hoegi-dong, Dongdaemoon-gu, Seoul) and changed its name to Chosun Conference Theological Seminary.
<b>1937</b>	- Against coerced shrine worship by Japanese invaders and in adherence to religious belief of not worshipping other gods, the seminary voluntarily withdrew from management.
<b>May. 1942</b>	- The school closed due to Japanese persecution.
<b>Sep. 1947</b>	- Chosun Conference Theological Seminary reopened in SDA Headquarters (Hoegi-dong, Dongdaemoon-gu, Seoul) with Pastor Won Ryun Sang as principal.
<b>Nov. 1949</b>	- The seminary purchased 70 ft2 of former imperial forests in Gyeonggido, Yangjoo-gun, Nohaymyeon, Gongdeukri (at present Hawarang-ro 815 Nowon-gu, Seoul) and relocated. It offering general, specialized and audit programs.
<b>Jun. 1961</b>	- Upon receiving national accreditation as a four-year college, the school was renamed Sahmyook Theological Seminary with Pastor Ji Goseok as its first dean.
<b>Mar. 1967</b>	- The seminary was renamed Sahmyook College; Domestic Science and Farming were upgraded into departments of Home Economics and Farm Education respectively.
<b>Dec. 1973</b>	- With government approval, Sahmyook College-affiliated College of Technology and Skills was opened; began recruitment for Dairy Farming and Food and Nutrition departments in 1974.
<b>Mar. 1992</b>	- The college was renamed Sahmyook University (SU).
<b>Feb. 1993</b>	- SU branch school was opened in Yuzhno Sakhalin, Russia.
<b>Mar. 2000</b>	- Completed construction of Theology Department.
<b>May. 2001</b>	- Signed academic exchange agreement with Andrews University, USA.
<b>Jun. 2001</b>	- Signed academic exchange agreement with La Sierra University, USA.
<b>Nov. 2002</b>	- SU's new U.I. was legislated and put in place.

<b>Sep. 2004</b>	- Signed academic exchange agreements with Bogenhofen Seminary, Germany; Sahmyook University, Russia; and Babcock University, Nigeria

# SU Character

Nurturing positive

## Character Building Education Center

Under the mission of producing professionals who contribute to the betterment of society, the center focuses on three core competencies: holistic, relationship and practice-based education, and carries out research, development, and education on a program unique to SU.

- **MVP Camp**

MVP Camp is the flagship character building program in which prospective students undergo four days of on-campus training before beginning freshmen year. It is SU's first character building education program that prepares students for future leadership in the world stage. Students learn alongside their peers, seniors, and faculty in activities, such as special lectures, cultural festivals, small group sessions, and community service.

- **MVP+ Training**

MVP+ is an extracurricular education program focused on character building offered in the first year. Career analysis by field of study, building community relations, and community volunteer activities, etc. are offered.

- **Glocal Leadership Education**

Students who excel in MVP+ are selected for further education towards becoming glocal leaders. Participants receive leadership training during the semester and carry out projects for the community during vacation.

- **Green Education**

In Green Education students experience first-hand what it means to "reap what you sow" by working in the fields of nature and harvesting their yields. As part of the freshmen core curriculum, students participate in Green Education two hours per week.

- **Conservatory**

For any and all students interested in learning a musical instrument, instruments as well as one-on-one lessons are available at the Conservatory. In breaking from conventional knowledge education, the program—the only one in the nation—touches the soul and brings forth the language of the heart.

- **Character Building Education for Youth**

Contracted and joined by various organizations, the program utilizes SU's expertise in delivering programs, such as Junior MVP Camps, addiction prevention programs, art therapy, school violence victim camps, family restoration camps, and others.

As part of an effort to increase global competitiveness, SU not only engages in active outbound globalization programs but also endeavors to attract international inbound students. As a result, our campus buzzes with domestic and international students as they mingle together.

- **Top-Ten Program**

SU offers short-term study abroad programs for students of excellent enrollment standing. All expenses are paid for short-term language programs. For long-term programs, 50 percent of tuition is covered by the sister university and 50 percent of airfare is taken up by SU.

- **Foreign Exchange Student Program**

Students have the opportunity to study abroad and earn transferable credits at one of SU's sister universities in the US, England, Japan, China, or other countries. The program provides students with cost-effective opportunities to study abroad and experience the world for themselves.

- **Language Exchange Program**

As means of strengthening global competency, SU offers an all-expenses-paid short term overseas language program. The program is worth three credits towards general education.

- **Short-term Cultural Experience Program**

Short-term Cultural Experience Program teaches Korean and provides cultural experiences to exchange students from sister universities from Japan, China, Taiwan, and Russia during vacation. The program introduces exchange students to Korean culture as well as to Sahmyook University.

- **Korean Language Course**

This program assists non-Korean speakers in learning Korean as well as adapting to the culture. Students are eligible to take regular classes upon successful completion.





## University specific specialization: a path to a small but robust university

To boost institutional competitiveness,  
SU has implemented a new educational policy  
based on selective focusing.

To this end, the university specific specialization program  
has been chosen as the next pivot for growth and  
the way forward. Representative of this work are  
specializations in health sciences and  
high-tech urban agriculture departments.

### ● Specialization in health sciences

For decades, SU's College of Health Science has enjoyed national prestige. Based on sound infrastructure and extensive knowhow in the field of health sciences, we have set in motion a specialization program for this particular area. Our objective is to become a leader in the field of health sciences by 2020. To meet this goal, we are building a lifestyle research center, developing an interdisciplinary model in the health sciences, contributing to the community via hands-on services, building clinical laboratories to produce ready practitioners, and strengthening ties with a prestigious overseas higher education institution.

### ● High-tech urban agriculture specialization

SU is leading the way in high-tech urban agriculture. Jointly with Gyeonggi Province Agriculture Research Institute and Seoul's Nowon District, SU has built the Nowon-Sahmyook Eco-Farm Center, an environment-friendly hightech urban agriculture facility. Here, by using LED lights pollution-free, organic vegetables are cultivated all year round. By developing an urban agriculture industrialization model on the shoulders of the center, SU is serving the common good of the community. Furthermore, we are nurturing professionals in the field of high-tech agriculture by fusing IT and agriculture education.





## Nurturing future leaders through creative human resource development

Future society is in need of ambitious, creative leaders. To nurture desirable future leaders, SU has set into motion three projects: ICT Human Resource Development, Child and Nature, and Art Wellness Platform. Through zeroing-in on creative human resource development, SU is seeking to strengthen student employability, attract more government funded programs, and expand services for the marginalized within the community.



### ● ICT Human Recourse Development

The objective of the program is to nurture technology-proficient entrepreneurs. Department of Business Administration and the Department of Management Information Systems are currently involved in the program. On the path to becoming creative professionals, students amass practical knowledge of management information systems in an academically interdisciplinary environment where humanities, social sciences, and information technology all come together for a truly integrated learning experience. Furthermore, partnership between university and business afford students on-site practical education, strengthening employability.

### ● Child in Nature

Child in Nature is a specialization track unique to the Department of Early Childhood Education. The goal is to foster teachers who are experts in nature-based early childhood education. The Department of Early Childhood Education has developed a systematic training program in line with the National Certificate for Early Childhood Forest Teacher. By utilizing the university-affiliated kindergarten and Korea Forest Service facilities for hands-on learning, the Department is providing major-intensive specialization learning to students.

### ● Art Wellness Platform

With the Department of Art and Design at the head, the program centers on art therapy. By developing and disseminating public art therapy programs such as local art and culture tours, art and play therapy, wellness silver culture contents development, and therapeutic art for the marginalized, the Department endeavors to serve the community in all possible ways. Last but not least, the Department is promoting art wellness education in developing countries in hopes of nurturing global art communicators.



### Commercialization Programs through Technology Transfer

We are endeavoring to discover superior technologies through the Invention Interview Program, support construction laboratory technology roadmap, build lab tour programs, and provide customized technology through technology packaging.

### Established the No. 3 technology holding company in Korea

Currently, we have established and are operating SU-Health Care grounded on pharmaceutical technologies, SU-Sahmyook Farm Products grounded on environment and horticultural technologies, and Emotion Korea Co., Ltd. Grounded on counseling psychology studies.

### Small and Medium Business Industry-University Cooperation Center

Small and medium-sized enterprises (SMEs) utilize the university's excellent manpower and equipment to solve field difficulties and receive funding for development of new technologies (NET) and new products (NEP) by matching funds from the government and local governments. Through our industry-academia-government consortium, we aim to propel technological advancement. In addition, we are helping SMEs to secure competitiveness both at home and abroad by developing technologies, improving products, improving processes, and upgrading root technology.

### Industry-University Cooperation Family Company

The Family Company exists to benefit both university and industry through the sharing of human and material resources via MOU. Areas of joint operation include research, sharing of research equipment, student on-site learning, worker professional development, scholarship endowment, student employment, and others.

### Research grants

SU is awarding grants and optimizing research funding policy to facilitate the effective transfer of research findings to educational services. We are also working tirelessly to secure self-sufficient core technology and self-perpetuating research.

### Industry-University Cooperation Support Center

The goals of the Industry-University Cooperation Support Center are to: 1) build industry-university friendly systems and education infrastructure; 2) improve and run capstone design, on-the-job training, entrepreneurial and career specific programs; 3) support and revitalize industry-university cooperation in conjunction with local communities and companies; and 4) design and implement measures that will expand industry-university cooperation.



## Building a system

Integration of innovative businesses and creative higher education institutions lies at the heart of the future growth engine. SU's Industry-University Cooperation Office has created a cooperation system that nurtures practice-ready professionals. Furthermore, shared R&D is affording SU a competitive edge. All this, in turn, is bringing growth to SU, industry, and community.







## Differentiated Career support program

Adds value to

The Job Career Support Center helps students make career decisions based on aptitude area and major. Through the center's systematic career management system, students are groomed into creative, competent men and women ready for the workforce.

## Unique and differentiated employment program

- **Customized programs by academic departments**

We provide employment and career programs customized to area of study. Freshmen and sophomore students participate in a career orientation where they learn about systematic career building and employment opportunities. Juniors and seniors participate in major-specific job skills training to boost employment opportunities and job success.

- **Employment Club**

Employment clubs at Sahmyook University offer like-minded students of similar job domains to work together to effectively prepare for employment. In addition to providing monthly club support grants, we provide mentoring by inviting former or current HR personnel or practitioners from specific job areas.

- **SU\*Job Competency Academy**

The academy provides core competencies enhancement training to cultivate 'capable individuals' in possession of Knowledge, Skill, and Attitude necessary in the work field.

- **SU\*Internship**

This program is designed to train outstanding individuals with field experience and practical skills. After pre-job training, students receive on-the-job training on site for 8 weeks. Students will receive support funds during the training period and will be awarded 2 to 3 credits for the SU SUIT internship course. International internship programs are also available.

- **Career and employment consultation program**

Sahmyook University, selected for the Job Center Project by the Ministry of Employment and Labor, provide high quality employment support services to students. With the help of personal career consultants, students design and plot their own career paths. A variety of services such as career and employment courses, extracurricular courses, and more are on offer.

- **Student career management system**

The student career management program at Sahmyook University allows students to manage career development from enrollment to graduation. Students accrue mileage by completing courses for successful employment (such as 2nd languages, various certifications, and community service). Students with high mileage points receive scholarships and certificates.





## We cultivate Individuals

## With a model Entrepreneurial spirit

As part of the career development program, Sahmyook University is invested in instilling a 'start-up' spirit in students. We have set up a start-up support team, which is dedicated to educating the students on starting a business. Various programs have been put in place to enhance student interest in start-up.



- **Start-up support facilities(Start-up Education Center, Maker Space, Student Start-up Center)**

Start-up Education Center - A student space where aspiring entrepreneurs can share ideas and mingle Maker Space – A space where students brainstorm and produce models using 3D printers Student Start-up Center – A space for student-entrepreneurs

- **SU- StartUp Club**

Sahmyook University provides support (item development, start-up camp, mentoring) to clubs with the entrepreneurial spirit and business acumen

- **SU- StartUp audition**

We hold start-up contests (idea contest, design competition, food truck contest, etc.) in order to discover promising entrepreneurs and raise interest for start-up business

- **Step-by-step start-up education**

We offer courses and extracurricular programs in how to start a business according to student demand.

- **Professional mentoring**

On and off-campus experts provide mentoring to solve difficulties of start-ups and to act as guides.

- **Start-up Incubator Center**

The Incubator Center is strengthening national competitiveness by cultivating "capable and ready entrepreneurs". From the founding to listing of a start-up, we provide administrative/public relations support and attract investment by working with companies

- **Total-Up Project**

SU is initiating the Total-Up Project based on their extensive know-how and experience in domestic and international volunteer work. The idea behind the project is to create lasting changes in the service areas through long-term (two to three years) planning and continued short-term volunteer work year after year.

- **Total-Up of Character Education**

We have made community service (community contribution) mandatory and developed various extracurricular volunteer activities for the purpose of building character in our students. To this end, our students participate in bibliotherapy in elementary schools in the vicinity. We also conduct a plethora of community service activities in conjunction with various institutions such as elementary and middle schools, welfare centers, volunteer centers, etc.

- **Service-Learning**

Service-Learning is a program that links volunteer work with courses with academic credit in order to assist students in applying theory and knowledge into real world circumstances. Students take elective and required courses in connection with Service-Learning. Then, they translate their in-course learning into structured volunteer work in their community. Through hands-on experience students are able to reflect, ruminate, and share feedback with each other—a process that leads to consolidation of practical expertise and knowledge.

- **Major-Specific Community Service**

SU students freely organize and participate in major-specific volunteer clubs, serving the community within their field of specialization. SU's Department of Physical Therapy help children suffering from cerebral palsy via rehabilitation through horseback riding. The Department of Food and Nutrition bake bread for the disabled. Students majoring in Japanese volunteer at comfort women shelters by translating and acting as guides. SU is proactively funding student volunteer work.

- **Student-centered field trip**

Student-centered field exploration team, consisting of 3-5 students and 1 faculty, selects a region and designs a volunteer activity tailored to suit the specific needs of the region. The program encourages self-directed learning and promotes volunteer work and in turn instill civil awareness and enhance community involvement in students.

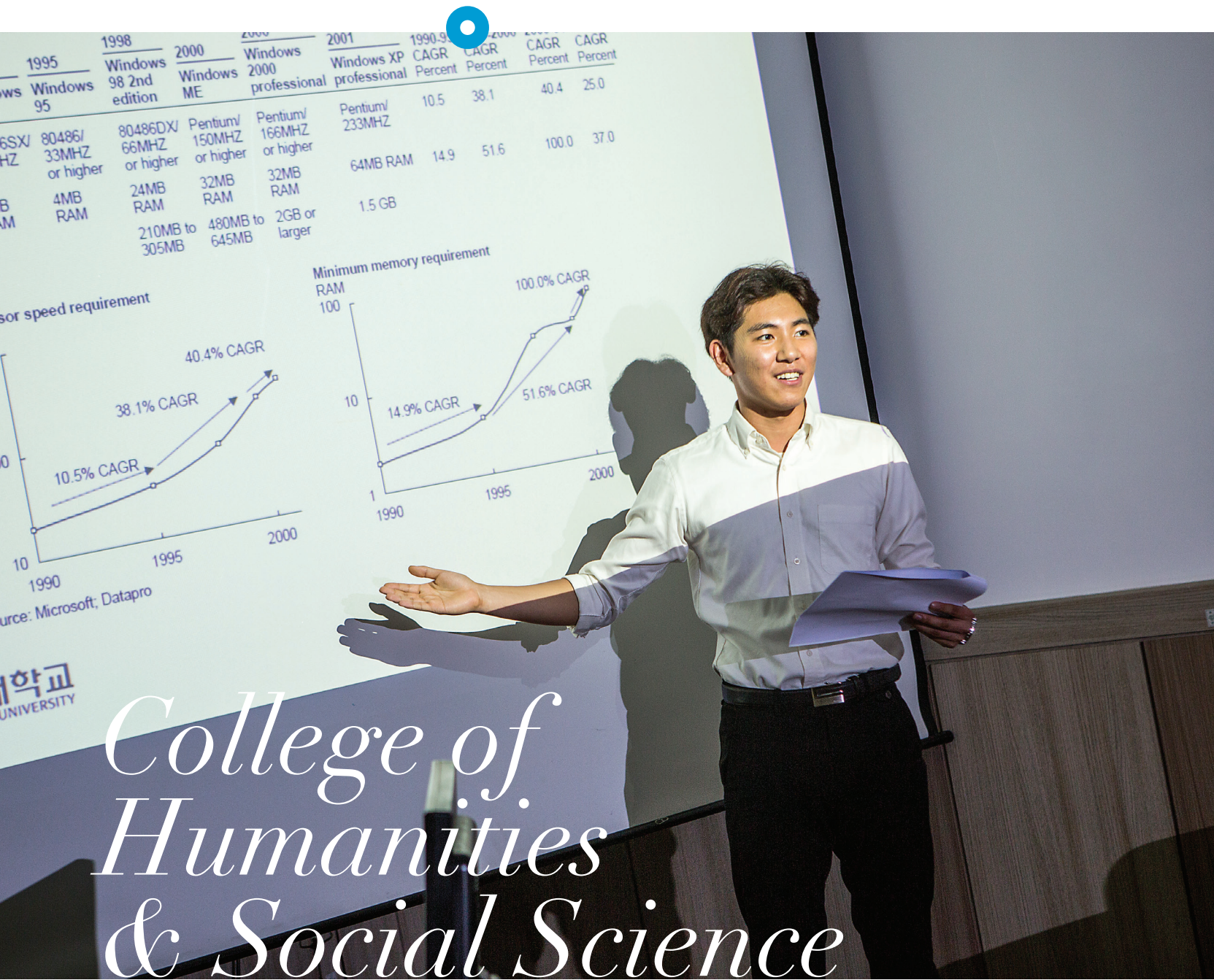
#### Department of Theology

### Department of Architecture (5 years)

The Department of Architecture operates a five-year education program for the international certification of architectural education in accordance with the regulations of the Universal Institute of Architects (U.I.A), and trains architects as creators of culture, as civil critics, and as natural and urban space architects. The program follows the accreditation standards of the UIA. No more than 10 students per class may take architectural design practicum and theories from professors and prominent architects who have rich real-world experience. Students who meticulously follow the systematic curriculum come out as ready architects. Graduates can also work in various academic fields such as architectural engineering and various design fields.

### Department of Architecture (4 years)

The Department of Architecture operates a four-year program to train architects as creators of culture, architects as social critics, and architects as coordinators of city and nature. Students learn about architectural design practice and theory under the guidance of professors and architects with abundant practical experience in small studios of less than 10 students. Students learn about various engineering theories related to structures and construction facilities in the field of architectural engineering. A systematic curriculum allows students to equip themselves for field work as architects and technicians upon graduation. Also, graduates can find work in various adjacent academic fields such as architectural engineering and various design fields.

### Department of Art & Design

The department cultivates future-oriented artist and designers of global standing. The program boast of faculty with ample international experience, cutting-edge facilities, industry-university-government collaborated employment and start-up programs, convergence capstone design systems, year-round and art & design exhibition programs.
