### | Purpose of Education |

Sahmyook Graduate School of Theology aims to foster faithful church leaders through education for spirituality grounded on the basic Adventist doctrines, nurture global evangelists thoroughly equipped with the spirit of mission for world evangelization, and produce scholarly, devoted and fully committed pastors who deal with a rapidly changing ministerial environment in an efficient way.

### | Objectives of Education |

1. To offer the major area of study that acquires the profound truth of the Bible by exploring into deep academic theories and application methods based on the Bible
2. To cultivate extensive leadership in preparation for becoming the leading role in world evangelization
3. To teach students to be fully committed to mission and dedication based on theological knowledge

### | Bylaws |

#### **Article 1 (Majors)**

The Theology department offers majors in Old Testament Studies, New Testament Studies, Systematic & Historical Theology, and Ministry & Mission Studies.

#### **Article 2 (Admissions)**

- ① Matters related to the admissions comply with the Graduate School Regulations and its Bylaws.
- ② The qualifications for applicants are as follows.
  1. The qualifications for applying for the master's program comply with the Bylaws of the Graduate School of Theology Regulations.
  2. Doctoral program (Ph.D.) for Theology
    - (1) Those who have received or are confirmed to receive a master's degree in theology or an equivalent degree (M.A., M.Div., M.P.Th., Th.M., etc.) from SDA graduate schools worldwide and have completed 12 or more credits from major areas of master's course. (if not taken enough, it

- can be completed as prerequisite courses after the admission)
- (2) Those who have been recommended by the head of affiliated institution or the Graduate School Committee of Theology
  3. In principle, the full-time professors of this university is prohibited from pursuing a degree program. However, in special cases, he/she may enter a degree program with the approval of the president of the university.
  4. Eligibility for transferring to this graduate school's degree program is limited to those who have studied at least one semester at Sahmyook University's Graduate School of Theology or other SDA graduate schools abroad.

#### Article 4 (Credits and Graduation Requirements)

The Students must complete the coursework according to the curriculum and earn the required number of credits, and pass the thesis/dissertation review.

- ① For the master's program, students must earn at least 6 credits of fundamental courses, 4 credits of thesis, 21 credits of required major courses,

and 9 credits of elective major courses.

- ② The Master of Theology (M.A.) program, which is specially provided for English speakers, requires completion of at least 40 credits of coursework regardless of area, including the thesis. If necessary, a course may be carried out as independent research.
- ③ For the doctoral program, students pursuing degree in Old Testament, New Testament, and Systematic & Historical Theology must earn at least 3 credits of fundamental courses, 12 credits of dissertation, 21 credits of minor courses, 24 credits of required major courses, and 9 credits of elective major courses. Students pursuing degree in Ministry & Mission must earn at least 3 credits of fundamental courses, 12 credits of dissertation, 33 credits of required major courses, and 12 credits of elective major courses

**Article 5 (Foreign Language Test and Biblical Language Prerequisite Courses)**

- ① The foreign language test required in the master's program is replaced by the completion of Greek or Hebrew-related courses in the fundamental area.
- ② The foreign language proficiency level of the doctoral program complies with the admission requirements, and if the student is admitted without meeting the language proficiency requirement, the student must submit a score equivalent to the qualifications within 3 semesters or pass the foreign language test conducted by the department. The compulsory biblical language courses, which are offered as prerequisite credits, must be completed within 3 semesters or pass an equivalent test. Those who do not pass within 3 semesters will be restricted from course registration until they meet language proficiency requirements by the decision of the Graduate School Committee of Theology

- ③ If a doctoral student has completed reading in Old Testament and the New Testament in the master's course, he/she is considered to have completed the prerequisite courses.
- ④ All students in the doctoral program must complete a second foreign language course (theological German, etc.), which is included in the coursework for their major area.

**Article 6 (Comprehensive Examination)**

- ① Comprehensive examination for master's program is exempted as credits are earned.
- ② The test subjects for the doctoral program are 4 subjects designated by the advisor (Old Testament, New Testament, and Systematic & Historical Theology majors: 3 subjects in the major area and 1 subject in the minor area). The scope of reading assignments and tests for the comprehensive exam is 10 reference books per subject. Therefore, 40 lists are prepared by the advisor and presented to students one semester before the exam.

**Article 7 (Thesis/Dissertation)**

Matters related to the academic advisor and thesis/dissertation comply with the Graduate School Regulations and its Bylaws.

**Article 8 (Committee of the Theology Department of the Graduate School)**

- ① Purpose: The Committee of the Theology Department of the Graduate School is established to comprehensively review important matters related to the operation of the Graduate School and important matters of the Theology Department.
- ② Composition: The Committee of the Theology Department of the Graduate School is composed of the department chair and department professors, and the dean(Graduate School of Theology) acts as the chairperson.
- ③ Term of Office: The term of office of the chairperson is consistent with the term of office of the department chair.
- ④ Function: The Committee of the Theology Department of the Graduate

School discusses, deliberates, and decides on the following matters.

1. Matters concerning the establishment and revision of educational objectives
  2. Organization and revision of the department's curriculum
  3. Planning and execution of academic activities for graduate students
  4. Matters related to the admission and graduation
  5. Matters related to thesis/dissertation guidance
  6. Appointment of thesis/dissertation advisors and reviewers
  7. Matters concerning foreign language test and comprehensive examination
  8. Selection of scholarship recipients
  9. Matters concerning department budget
  10. Course evaluation, development and production of lecture materials
- ⑤ Meetings: The committee is convened by the chairperson when the chairperson deems it necessary, and the meeting of the committee is opened with the attendance of a majority of the members present, and resolutions are made with the consent of a majority of the members present. The chairperson has the same voting rights as the members.

**Article 9 (Student Council)**

The Department of Theology supports the student council of Theology, an autonomous organization that promotes research and cooperation among students.

**Article 10 (Mutatis Mutandis)**

Matters not specifically stipulated in these bylaws comply with the Graduate School Regulations.

### **Methods of Theological Research**

Instructs principles and methods of research in various fields of theology and practical tips for writing a dissertation

### **Practicum in Ministry**

In order to gain practical experience in churches and other environments where Christian education is conducted, field practice is required. Students choose a church or school as a place for ministry practice. Ministry field practice is conducted according to the ministry plan, group guidance, individual guidance, home visits, and result reports. After graduation, those who wish to serve a church as a minister are required to practice as missionaries for three semesters.

### **Masteral Colloquium**

This is an academic seminar meeting introducing professional and academic theories and practices to the field of theology and ministry by in-depth discussions on overall issues of theology and ministry with professors, students, and church leaders.

### **Readings in NT Greek**

Cultivate the ability of commentary by analyzing the grammatical and syntactic characteristics and meaning of the original text while reading the Greek New Testament

### **Reading in Hebrew Old Testament**

Cultivate the ability of commentary by analyzing the linguistic and grammatical characteristics and meaning of the original text while reading the Hebrew Old Testament

### **Theological German**

Cultivate reading comprehension skills to read and refer to theological articles, theses, and writings published in German

### **Seminar for Dissertation**

Instruct students who are writing doctoral dissertation, teach them how to write it, and encourage them to proceed with it.

### **Introduction to the Old Testament**

Provides general background and basic knowledge needed to understand the message and theology of each book of the Old Testament and the whole

### **Study Tour to the Bible Land**

Exploration and field lectures on Bible-related countries, the field of the Bible

### **Old Testament Hermeneutics**

An overview of the theory and practice of biblical hermeneutics and the history of hermeneutics, especially the practice and application of the hermeneutics of

the Old Testament.

### **Old Testament Theology**

Understanding the central thought of the Old Testament by comparing and studying scholars who have written about Old Testament theology as part of biblical theology

### **Messianism of the Old Testament**

An in-depth study of Christ in the Old Testament, comparative study with the New Testament

### **Seminar in Old Testament Theology 1, 2, 3**

A course of intensive research and discussion on important themes of Old Testament theology

### **Seminar in Old Testament History**

A course of intensive study and discussion of major parts or issues of Old Testament history

### **Seminar in Old Testament Backgrounds**

Research and discussion of background issues in the Old Testament

### **Biblical Archaeology**

The course of examining archaeological artifacts excavated in areas related to the Bible and their relationship with the Bible

### **Advanced Biblical Hebrew**

In-depth study and practice of Old Testament Hebrew syntax, parts of speech, and exegesis

### **Septuagint Greek**

The course of learning Greek grammar, the language of the Septuagint, a translation of the Old Testament, and reading and studying the text

### **Reading in Hebrew Old Testament**

Cultivate the ability of commentary by analyzing the linguistic and grammatical characteristics and meaning of the original text while reading the Hebrew Old Testament

### **Seminar in Ancient Near East Languages**

The course of discussing and researching ancient Near Eastern languages

### **Exegesis of Prophets**

Study the important ideas, influences, and difficult passages of each book of the prophets as an overview of the entire book of the prophets

### **Exegesis of Job**

Commentary on the Book of Job, interpreting key ideas and difficult passages

### **Exegesis of Psalms**

Commenting on the Psalms and studying the main ideas

### **Exegesis of Genesis**

Annotate Genesis, the beginning of the Pentateuch, and study the creation beliefs, which is the basis of all theological themes and biblical studies.

### **Exegesis of the Pentateuch**

It is a general course of the Pentateuch, which is the basis of the Bible, and studies the main ideas and themes of each book.

### **Exegesis of the Historical Books**

The course of commenting on the text of the Old Testament historical books and interpreting key ideas or difficult passages

### **Exegesis of the Wisdom and Hymnic Literature**

The course of annotating the text of wisdom literature and poetry literature and interpreting major ideas or difficult passages

### **Exegesis of Daniel**

The course of commenting on the text of the book of Daniel and interpreting key ideas or difficult passages

### **Minor Prophets of the 8th Century**

The course of commenting on the text of the Minor Prophets recorded in the B.C. 8th century and interpreting key ideas or difficult passages

### **Minor Prophets of the 7th-5th Centuries**

The course of commenting on the text of the Minor Prophets recorded in the B.C. 7th-5th centuries and interpreting key ideas or difficult passages

### **Seminar in Old Testament Themes**

A course of intensive research and discussion on special topics of the Old Testament or main parts of Old Testament theology

### **Apocalypticism**

An intensive study of the parts of the apocalyptic literature of the Old Testament

### **Backgrounds of the New Testament**

Encourage understanding of the New Testament by examining the historical, political, religious, and cultural background of the time the New Testament was written.

### **Study Tour to the Bible Land**

Studying the geography and history of the Bible in the field by exploring and traveling to the Holy Land during the vacation period under the guidance of the academic advisor.

### **Introduction to the New Testament**

Provides general background and basic knowledge needed to understand the message and theology of each book of the New Testament and the whole

### **Biblical Archaeology**

Research on the relationship between the New Testament and archaeological



excavation sites or excavated items related to the New Testament

### **Intertestamental Period**

Research and understanding of the historical, political and religious environment of the intervening period between the Old and New Testaments

### **Seminar in New Testament Backgrounds**

Select and study specific topics to further understand the New Testament

### **NT Textual Criticism**

Teaches how to compare the characteristics and differences of various manuscripts of the Bible and examine the readings of the New Testament text.

### **Introduction to New Testament Greek**

This course helps students to acquire basic grammar of New Testament Greek and develop basic sentence comprehension skills

### **Intermediate New Testament Greek**

Strengthens reading comprehension and vocabulary of New Testament Greek

### **Advanced New Testament Greek**

In-depth study and practice of New Testament Greek syntax, parts of speech, and exegesis

### **Seminar in Hellenistic Greek**

The purpose this course is to shed light on the commentary of the New Testament by reading and analyzing selected Greek words from the New Testament, the Septuagint, Papharus, Josephus, Philo, or the writings of the early church fathers.

### **New Testament Theology**

Understanding the central thought of the New Testament by comparatively studying the arguments of scholars who have written about New Testament theology as part of biblical theology

### **Seminar in New Testament Theology 1, 2, 3**

A course of intensive research and discussion on important themes of New Testament theology

### **Galatians**

A Study on the Original Commentary on the Main Part of Galatians and its Contents

### **Synoptic Gospels**

Original commentary on the main parts of the Gospels of Matthew, Mark, and Luke and a study of their contents

### **Romans**

An original text commentary on the main part of Romans and a study of its contents

### **Pauline Writings**

A study of the original commentary on the main parts from Romans to Philemon and its contents

### **The Acts of the Apostles**

A study on the original commentary on the main part of the Acts of the Apostles and its contents

### **Exegesis of the General Epistles**

A study of the original commentary and its contents on the main parts from James to Jude

### **Exegesis of Johannine Writings**

A Study on the Original Commentary on the Gospel of John and the main parts of John's Epistles and their contents

### **Exegesis of the Book of Revelation**

A study on the original commentary on the main part of the Book of Revelation and its contents

### **New Testament Hermeneutics**

An overview of the theory and practice of biblical hermeneutics and the history of hermeneutics, in particular the practice and application of New Testament hermeneutics.

### **Biblical Hermeneutics**

A study on the definition and necessity of biblical interpretation, the method of biblical interpretation and conflicting issues, biblical inspiration and canonical theology, and the relationship between the Bible and Ellen White's writings.

### **Doctrine of Revelation and Inspiration**

A study of the meaning of revelation and inspiration, the theology and authority of encounters with propositional truth, theology, and their meaning for Christian experience

### **Principles and Methods of Theology**

A Study on the nature, functions and practices of Theological studies

### **Doctrine of God**

A study of God's nature and attributes, relationship with the world, divine foreknowledge and providence, and the Trinity

### **Doctrine of the Holy Spirit**

A Study on the personality and work of the Holy Spirit in the Plan of Redemption

### **Doctrine of Man**

A study of the origin of man, the fall and sin, their nature and consequences, the essence of man, the concept of the immortality of the soul, and the image of God

### **Doctrine of the Church**

A study on the relationship between the nature of the church, church politics, church and Christ, the Bible, church rites, ministry and the Holy Spirit

### **Doctrine of the Sanctuary**

A Study on the Earthly and Heavenly Sanctuary, and the Sanctuary Service of Jesus Christ in Exodus, Leviticus, Daniel, Hebrews and Revelation

### **Contemporary Theology**

A study of major trends in theology in the 19th and 20th centuries, such as liberalism and neo-orthodoxy formed by Schleiermacher, Barth, and Bultmann

### **Seminar in Bible and Science**

Theology of Ellen G. White

An analytical study of the major theological themes in Ellen G. White's writings and their influence on Adventist theology.

### **Principles of Christian Ethics**

A study of the process of making ethical decisions about problems in modern society from the perspective of the Adventist Church.

### **Christian Apologetics**

As a study that pursues theological apologetics in relation to the issues raised in Christian theology, it studies the definition and necessity of Christian apologetics, the history and issues of apologetics, apologetics and worldview, apologetics and ethics, etc.

### **Christian Social Ethics**

Research on the relationship between church and society, state and politics, race, women's role and economic justice

### **Seminar in Philosophical Theology**

The relationship between philosophical and theological ideas from a biblical angle and an overview and critique of Tillich's philosophical theology

### **History of the Early Church**

Examining the early history of world Christianity (until A.D. 604) focusing on institution, theological thought, liturgy, mission, practice, experience, etc.

### **History of the Medieval Church**

This course deals with various phenomena of the Christian Middle Ages around the world, especially the emergence of the papacy, the evangelization of Europe, the great schism of the church, scholasticism, church and state, liturgical development, faith and reason

### **History of the Reformation**

A study focusing on the occurrence and development of the Reformation and the lives and thoughts of the Reformers

### **Ecumenism**

A study of the principles, development, structure and theological issues of the

ecumenical movement

### **History of the Korean Church**

Studying the introduction and development of Christianity in Korea, and the history and characteristics of Korean Christian denominations

### **The Development of the Modern Church**

Studying the history of Christianity developed in the 19th and 20th centuries from the perspective of theological development

### **History of SDA Theology**

Analyzing and evaluating the development of SDA theology and its characteristics

### **History of the Korean SDA Church**

Analytical study on the beginning and development of the Korean Adventist Church

### **History of SDA Missions**

Analyzing and evaluating the emergence and development of the Adventist world mission movement

### **Christian Perspective on History**

A study on Christian historical understanding of what history is

### **Problems in Church History**

Selected and discussed important topics in church history

### **Seminar in Church History 1, 2, 3**

Among various issues related to church history, intensive research and discussion are conducted by selecting a topic that fits the discourse of the times.

### **Early Theologians & Their Teachings**

A study of theological developments in Christian history from the 1st to the 5th centuries

### **Medieval Theologians & Their Teachings**

A study on the theological development of the Middle Ages in Christian history from the end of the 5th century to the end of the 15th century

### **Reformers & Their Teachings**

A study of theological issues developed in Germany, Switzerland, France, England, and Scotland during the Reformation in the 16th century

### **Contemporary Theologians and Their Teachings**

A Study on the Theological Thoughts of Modern Theologians

### **The Development of Christian Doctrines**

A Study on the History of Doctrine Development from Augustine to the Reformation

### **Homiletics**

A study on various methods of writing sermons such as text sermons, topic sermons, commentary sermons, example sermons, and electric sermons for effective sermon writing

### **Evangelistic Preaching**

Emphasis is placed on researching and developing various preaching methods that can deliver messages appropriate to the target audience at various levels in an effective way at various evangelism meetings.

### **Seminar in Preaching**

By analyzing and studying various problems experienced by preachers in the field of ministry, the role of preachers and the function of sermons, which are the most important means of saving souls, are further strengthened and various theories and practices are verified for efficiency.

### **Vocal Training for Pastors**

Study the theory and practice of professional vocalization in conversation and preaching and apply it to communication and preaching to deepen the pastor's influence and preserve vocal organs in the best condition.

### **Preaching from the New Testament**

In this course, students learn to select texts with preaching value from the New Testament and conceptualize and apply them through exegetical preaching

### **Preaching from the Old Testament**

In this course, students learn to select texts with preaching value from the Old Testament and conceptualize and apply them through exegetical preaching

### **Expository Preaching**

By studying the historical background, context, purpose, and construction method of the message given in the Bible, students increase their expertise and experience in constructing sermons that reflect biblical concepts more consistent with the text.

### **Seminar in Word and Worship**

Major issues related to preaching and worship in the church are selected and intensively studied

### **Church Leadership and Administration**

A course of researching and acquiring effective administrative theories and leadership skills to improve pastors' church leadership

### **Church Administration English 1, 2**

Learn the administrative English necessary to grow as a church leader based on an international church.

### **Youth Leadership**

In this course, students acquire more effective youth guidance theories and experiences by researching and analyzing the overall characteristics and

guidance principles of young people in order to successfully guide them

### **Church and the Educational Ministry**

As a way to increase the missionary function of the church, pastors develop and practice various educational methods, while studying the theory and practice necessary to make the church an institution for nurturing evangelists from an educational point of view, so that church can handle missionary function effectively in the present generation.

### **Seminar in Leadership**

In this course, the students identify various problems in church leadership and find ways to solve them more effectively in order to improve the leadership of pastors and administrators who have to handle administration and leadership in churches and institutions at various levels.

### **Architecture for Worship**

Prepare students to contribute to the best in the church construction by acquiring knowledge about various processes for construction, such as forming a building committee for church construction that meets the purpose of worship, mission, service, education, etc., and acquiring knowledge about design, building equipment, and building materials.

### **Seminar in Laity Training**

In this course, students study various theories and methods to train the laity as evangelists and volunteers for the salvation of souls according to their spiritual gifts in order to effectively carry out the missionary function of the church.

### **Spiritual Leadership**

Through this course, students understand of the principles of biblical leadership based on the Bible and to develop leadership skills that practically apply them in the 21st century ecclesiastical context.

### **Seminar in Leadership and Church Organization**

Examine the efficiency, timeliness, and cultural nature of the current church organization and administration, and develop appropriate leadership that can contribute to the utmost in confirming the existence of the church and fulfilling its mission in the 21st century.

### **Theology of Spirituality**

Examine the biblical and historical significance and background of spirituality, understand the actual spiritual development plan in accordance with the Bible, and learn through practice

### **Pastoral Care and Pastoral Psychology**

Study all the cases that are subject to the pastor's visit and care in detail, and learn through theory and practice how to bring about the best interest and

healing biblically and psychologically.

### **Church and Urban Ministry**

A study of various theories to improve the spiritual life of urban church members with various needs in various lifestyles and to improve the missionary function of urban churches to save souls living in cities.

### **Theology of Ministry and Pastoral Ethics**

Studying theories and practices to handle more effective pastoral ministry by identifying the biblical origin, purpose, and various functions of the pastor's pastoral ministry from a biblical theological perspective.

### **Seminar in Youth Ministry**

Identifying problems that are expressed according to the developmental process of adolescents, researching and guiding them in light of social and cultural environments, so that adolescents can grow spiritually and adapt to their homes, churches, and societies

### **Seminar in Ministry**

A study on theories and techniques to identify and solve various problems that arise in relation to ministry, administration, preaching, and evangelism that pastors face in the church.

### **Seminar in Pastoral Counseling**

A course of research and development focusing on advanced counseling methods and special fields to analyze, identify, and solve various problems that arise in various personal relationships and life accompanying pastoral activities

### **Seminar in Specialized Ministries**

Seminars for special fields such as campus evangelism, industrial evangelism, elderly and disabled evangelism, hospital evangelism, prison evangelism, barracks evangelism, apartment evangelism, etc.

### **Seminar in Church Planting**

Searching for and researching church planting processes and effective methods

### **Seminar in Worship**

The core issues related to Christian worship are selected by subject and studied

### **Worship and Church Music**

Studying the theory necessary for the harmony and unity of the important elements of worship, such as sermon, prayer, music, and communion, and learn to apply the theory so that spiritual and true worship can take place.

### **History & Theology of Adventist Worship**

Studying the historical development and development process of worship and the development process of worship theology in Christian history

### **Theology of Health**

Covers biblical health theology and Adventist health theology

### **Personal Evangelism**

The course of studying the method of saving souls through personal contact based on the Bible, analyzing and studying the method of saving souls that meets the needs of interpersonal relationships and humanity, and applying them to the ministry.

### **Health Evangelism**

As a means of evangelism through theory and practice students acquire the necessary professional knowledge and practical experience to apply health problems, which are a pressing concern and necessity of modern people.

### **Witness to People of Other Religions**

Emphasis is placed on researching and developing various methods of evangelizing people belonging to other religions such as Muslims, Judaism, Hinduism, and Buddhism.

### **Small Group Evangelism**

In connection with making disciples, which is an important evangelism method that maximizes the effectiveness of church growth and evangelism, students learn to form a small group, an ideal missionary unit, teach them, determine them, and acquire theories and skills to lead them to Christ.

### **Seminar in Evangelism**

A study on various evangelism theories and methods to lead souls to Christ by more effectively approaching various rapidly changing modern societies by analyzing overall problems faced in evangelism activities

### **Seminar in Multi-Media Evangelism**

Develop and practice audio-visual evangelism methods using various video media

### **Seminar in Prophetic Evangelism 1, 2**

The prophetic themes of the Book of Daniel are composed and presented as an evangelical message according to the church's unique basic faith and biblical interpretation.

### **Mission to the Northern Areas**

Establish a more effective mission strategy by closely studying the political, economic, social, and cultural situations of the socialist or communist system, such as China, the former Soviet Union, and North Korea, which are the new doors and challenges of gospel missions. In particular, it is a course to prepare and respond more actively by establishing multifaceted strategy to spread the gospel to North Korea.

### **Seminar in Church Growth**

By analyzing various pastoral, administrative, social, and cultural issues related



to church growth, a strategy for more effective growth is established, and in particular, the unique characteristics and methods of growth of the Seventh-day Adventist Church are studied.

### **Studies in Asian Missions**

By studying the theological tendencies and characteristics that have arisen in the special circumstances of the Asian region, students focus on finding a way to effectively mission in the Asian region, examining the influence of liberation theology and Minjung theology, and developing and promoting biblical faith and missionary methods suitable for Asia.

### **Missionary Anthropology**

Study and apply the principles and practices of anthropology to facilitate missions by overcoming cultural differences in the intended mission field.

### **Theology of Contextualization**

A theological study of the problem of indigenization in the process of Christianity settling in a specific cultural area

### **Mission Strategies for the 3rd World Countries**

Study the cultural characteristics and social conditions of the Third World, including Asia, and develop strategies to spread the gospel more effectively.

### **Seminar in Theology of Missions**

Analyzing missionary ideology on topics such as the theological basis of mission, human nature, the church, and the concept of salvation.

### **Seminar in Evangelism**

Discover, research, and review the problems related to effective evangelism suitable for the reality of the 21st century and search for the ways to improve conflicting problems

### **History of Seventh-day Adventist Missions**

Research, analysis and review of the development and purpose of the missionary movement of the Adventist Church

### **History of World Missions**

By studying the missionary history of the church from the 1st century AD, when the history of Christianity began, to the present, students gain necessary historical, theological, and practical knowledge, and in particular, through the missionary history of the Seventh-day Adventist Church, students acquire necessary historical knowledge to establish more progressive missionary policies.

### **Practicum in Overseas Missions**

Participation in overseas missionary activities to have practical experience as a missionary, and credits are awarded in consideration of the activity status during the period

**Seminar in World Missions**

Establish a more effective mission strategy by closely analyzing and studying all the problems that cause inefficiency and obstacles to foreign missions, especially emphasizing the world mission strategy of the Seventh-day Adventist Church.

**Nurture and Growth of the Church**

Studying various theories and principles presented in the Bible necessary for the growth of the church, establishing a church growth strategy for both evangelism and ministry so that more successful ministry and missionary activities can be achieved

**Seminar in Strategies for Foreign Missions**

Establish support measures by mobilizing church organizations or administrative systems to be suitable for carrying out missions in East Asia and northern regions centered on the Korean Peninsula more efficiently, discover current obstacles, and devise ways to cope with and improve them.

**Seminar in Current Issues in Missions**

Study and analyze current issues of missions that affect effective preaching of the gospel to the world
